

(I Can't Get T'Know) Satisfaction

*A Parody of "(I Can't Get No) Satisfaction" Recorded by the Rolling Stones
(John 10:10)*

In the original version, the Rolling Stones' song reflects a realization of one's pursuit to find satisfaction through worldly means is merely "vanity of vanities" (Ecclesiastes 12:8). Only discontentment and a feeling of hopelessness comes from the song's content.
